HAWAIIAN TIKI-MEN:

Created as visual representations of the unseen forces that protect, harm, and bring luck, etc. Similar to the various gods that the ancient Greeks believed were in control of the sea, lightning, love and peace, etc.



KU:

The tiki god of war who along with 3 others caused light to shine upon the world.

LONO:

The god of fertility and peace, the god of music who was identified with rain and food plants.

KANE:

The god of light and life who created the sky, Earth and heaven. He is the father of all men.

KANALOA:

The god of sea symbolized by the squid.

Students will create a Balinese inspired puppet from a story that they create using the exaggerated features typically seen in the traditional Bali Puppets.



Haitian Metal Art

Embossed, punctured and textured Haitian metal art is a traditional and beautiful expression of a very colorful culture. Students will look at various Haitian examples and then create a radial design picture on metal around an animal of their choice. They will emboss, puncture, create textures, and color their metal art wall hanging.
